Faculty members pursuing tenure and career success in research intensive institutions, academics transitioning from teaching to research institutions, and faculty carrying out research in teaching contexts will be interested in this Summer Research Institute. This institute is designed to promote successful research projects and careers among faculty from under-represented groups working in areas of crime and criminal justice. *During the institute, each participant will complete the project proposed in this application (either a research paper or grant proposal) in preparation for journal submission or agency funding review.* The institute will provide resources for completing the project, senior faculty mentorship, networking opportunities, professional development workshops, and a culminating symposium. Travel and living expenses will be covered by the institute.

The Summer Research Institute is organized by Professors Ruth D. Peterson and Lauren J. Krivo, Criminal Justice Research Center and Department of Sociology at The Ohio State University. Funding is provided by the National Science Foundation and The Ohio State University.

Full application must include:

1. Completed application form;
2. Statement of interest (double-spaced, 250-500 words);
3. Draft of complete research paper/proposal with full references and tables (if relevant).
Please do not send a set of unedited chapters from your dissertation;
4. Curriculum Vitae (CV).

Send six (6) copies of the full application to the address below. **All materials must be postmarked by February 5, 2010.**

Eligibility: Applicants must hold regular tenure-track appointments in U.S. institutions and demonstrate how their involvement broadens the participation of underrepresented groups in crime and justice research.

Specific Instructions:

1. *Completed application form.* Fill in all personal information. The "Proposed Project Title" refers to the paper (or grant proposal) you plan to complete during the institute.
2. *Statement of interest (double-spaced, 250-500 words).* In this short essay please:
 - a) introduce and briefly describe your research project and its intended contribution;
 - b) explain how and why you would benefit from participation in the institute, & how this involvement broadens participation of underrepresented groups; and
 - c) explain what types of activities will facilitate achievement of your goals.
3. *Paper draft.* This paper may be a draft of a completed paper that needs additional work before sending out for publication review, a paper that was submitted for publication but failed in the review process, or an extended proposal for a research paper or grant application. This paper must be the project that the applicant intends to complete while at the Summer Research Institute.
