Boylan Officers Casper Fischer, and Joseph Elmore, while making their rounds on platform #2 of the I C R R at the foot of Julia street, they heard the moaning of a person under the platform, and upon investigation discovered that it was a negro who was suffering with a gun shot wound of the right hip the station was at once notified by Doorman John J. Gasey, of the Inspectors Office, and Acting Corporal Edward Fitzpatrick, and Patn Chas L. Jenkins, procn the 1st Precinct patrol Wagon, with Driv eeded to the above scene axe Moran and Bath Charles Wolsch, in charge and upon reaching the above scene found there Corporal Thos H. Loeper was conveyed to the Charity Hospital in the 1st Precinct patrol wagon, where his wound was examined and found to be serious, O'Reill was taken to the Mospital, and confronted with Losper, whom he identified as the negro who was with him when he was arrested, and stated that he was the same negro who had robbed Wm. Brnst galoon, and gave him (O'Neill) the suit case containing the bottles of liquor, he had in his possession at the time he was arrested, Statements were taken from O'Meill and also From Loeper, which are hereto attached other statements will follow report Clark and Operator, James Kenny, of the Inspectors was notified at 1-30 A.M. by Acting Corporal Fitzpatrick, and District Attorney StClaire Adams, and Chief Dtectives Jas W. on the right side, Patterson after being shot walked is out of the salcon and went out Poydras st, and when in the middle of the block, between Explain Saratoga and Franklin sts, fell in the street. The Ambulance was summoned and patterson, conveyed to the Charity Hospital, where it was stated that his condition was critical,

gavoca was arrested in the saloon where the shooting took place by Sergt Was As Anderson and Corporal Jas Clavin, and Patn Wm. J. Browner and looked up in this station charged with shooting and dangerously wounding, Savoca was taking to the Charity Hospital where in the presence of Detective Walter Methe and Stenographer Augustus Phelps, patterson was asked if he could identify the man who shet him, and stated he could and when asked if he thought he was going to die, preparatory to taking his dying statement, he stated he did not care if he died or not, owing to mans condition, was minute to get a statement from him relative to the shooting, the Revolver a 38 calibre Colts special was secured from Charles Savoca, by Patn Wm. J. Mary Cook and Jos Asbury, colored, aged 17 years, residing No. 3310 Jackson Remue, were fussing about a guitar which was the property of Mary Cook, at the time Mary Cook was on the upper side of the Melpomene Canal while Joe Asbury was on the lower side of the Canal and Mary Cook was walking in the direction of Calves street, and Joe Buggs who is blind states that he

heard three shets fired and then heard his Sister (MaryCook) Cry \*Oh Joe I am shet, Bit shot me meaning that Joe Asbury who is also known as Bit had shot her. Charles, A. Smith, Jr. colored, aged 16 years, residing at We. 2105 South Prieur street, was also interviewed and stated that some time between 9 and 10 oclock this P. M. he was at a Fish frey at a Church en Jackson corner of Prieur street and Joe Asbury came up to him and teld him that he had killed Sing meaning Mary Cook, but did not say why he had done so.

There were no eye witnesses to the killing, but it is very evident that Mary Gook and Joe Asbury were lovers, and that while Mary Gook was on her way to get a guitar she met Asbury and they quarroled which terminated in Asbury firing three shots at her one of which struck her in the heart killing her.

On entering the house re Pourcine continued through to her room, and taking off her cost looked towards the front of the house . Saw Delay Tyhousse take a razor from a dreseer drawer, and knowing that relayhou

\*sschad threatened to kill his wife, on several occasions, and on account of Lealousy. Mrs Pourcine became frightened and ran from the licuse, to summon Aid, Delayhousse evidently attacked his wife with the razor, in his ed Ro. om, as blood stairs were found on the floor, Mrs Pelayhousse then attempted to escape from the house, but was pursued by Delayho sse, who overtook her in the Hall-way, cutside the ath Room, A struggle evidently occurred, as the wall in the Hall way is covered with blood When rs Delayhousse fell. The two negroes were ordered to throw up their hands, when one of the negroes put his hand towards his hip pocket as if to draw a waepon. Both of the officers firing at about the same time, one of the negroes fell to the floor, the other are negroes ran to the window whence he had entered, both of the Boylan Officers discharging their revolver at him. The negroes managed to get out of the window, but lost his balance and fell in an alley the side of the building, a distance of about 40 feet, sustaining a fracture of the neck, deal evidently occuring intstantly i evidently occurring intstantly 1

The negroe who was shot on the third floor was held a captive by the Boylan Officers untill the arrvival of Sergeant William A Anderson and Patrolman William J Brown, who were later joined by Cheif of Detectives George Long. A short time after Belle Monroe in comapny with a woman named Liza France is (cel) residing at #2029 Lafayette St; The Monroe woman began cursing and abusing Maxwell, who arose to his feet, as he did the weman pulled large knife which she had concealed in her hand at her side, and plunged the blade into maxwells left breast, about one inch above the mipple

the knife blade ranging downwards and penertrating the heart.

Adder being stabled Maxwell stepped down and poiked man object from the street, either a small piece of cinder or reck, when a daughter of Belle Monroe, named Alberts Downes came up and picked up a brick threating Maxwell. Haxwellthen staggred to his residence a distance of about 40 feet, and staggered in the front room where he fell to the floor and expired before medical aid could reach him. Belle Monroe after stabbing Maxwell ran back to the Francis womans house, but came icut almost instantly and ran out Lafayette St towards S Pricur St, thence to Tulane Ave where the made her escape.

Witness of #1537 Canal streets who was on the Barr Pirst floor on hearing the shoots hurried to the office room #819 and found Mr. Henderson lying on the floor bloading from the wound in the stemach and the right hand. 

I would report that at 7:05 this P.M. Tuesday June 13th 1911, having received a telephone message from Mr Joseph O Davis of the 'Claiborne

Barn, that there was a shooting on Urquhart near Music Street. Sergeant Strobel immediately proceeded to the scene and on arriving at the house 2416 Urquhart St, found a colored woman , named Inez Simon, aged 19 years, married, and residing at 2416 Urquhart St. lying on the floor of the front room, dead, with a pistol shot wound in the centre of her forehead, she having been killed by her husband, Wilfred J Simon (colored) age 26 years, residing 1/27 Hospital Street, The shooting was done with a 38 Caliber , blue stepl, Smith and Wesson revolver six shooter, #4998 which was turned ever to Bergeant George Strobel by Dr. Joseph M Tollivar residing At 1357 St-Anthony Street, who had received the revolver from one Edward Serpas, residing 1302 Misic St. who had heard the shots fired and ran into the house, and took the revolver out of the hands of Wilfred J Simon. It was also found that Simon had shot and wounded his Mether-in-law Charlette,

Bart, aged 42 years, residing at the house 2416 Urquhart St, she receiving a bullet wound in the chest penetrating the lung, she was taken to the Charity Hospital in the Ambulance where her wounds was pronounced very serious. The cause of the trouble was according to the version given by Simon, that he called at the residence of his Mother--in-law at 6:30 P.M. this Tuesday June 13th 1911, accompnaied by his wife to get some association papers which his wife had in her possession and he said to his wife on her remaining too long, was she going to stay all night? and just then his wife and his mother-in-law came from the second room to the front room, and his mother-in-law pointed a revolver at him, and snapped it, he then drew his revolver out and fired five alets with the above results. The revolver which he claims his mother-in-law Hrs Bart used was found behind a step on the outside of the street on Urquhart wear between Music and St-Roch Ave, where she was seen to throw the weapon after the shooting by a Conductor on the Claiborne car line named Henry Wolkart residing at 2035 Lafayette Ave, who picked the weapon up, an American Bull Dog revolver five shooter fully loaded 38 Caliber, no number, with one cartridge snapped, the revolver was turned over to Dr. Joseph M Tollivar by Bart , and Dr Tollivar turned the revolver over to Sergeant Strobel. After the shooting the father of the dead woman named Joseph A Bart ran into the room and was attacked by Simon, and was beaten about the face with the revolver, receiving a slight wound on the left side of the face. The mother of the girl Mrs Bart stated at the Hospital that she was shot by Simon without cause prevecation. The weapon used by Mrs Bart was identified by Joseph A Bart (her husband) as his revolver, and same had blood on the handle. From a statement made to District Attorney Adams by Simon, he had had a charge made against him by his wife for wife desertion, and he was discharged this date tuesday June 13th 1911, without date. The both revelves were taken to the Coroners Office as evidence. Several witnes sees who heard the shooting were taken interviewed, and statements which will be found attached to this report. The, body of the dead woman was taken to the mergne by order of the Coroner in the Patrol wagon in charge of Driver Louis Fink and Patrolman Joseph U Landry. Rampart st, who had called upon Ophelia Williams tried to make Wheeler step assaulting his mistress but without results and as Wheeler was leaving the premises threatening to return shortly with a revelver and kill his mistress, Ophelia Williams then took a 38-cal, six chamber Smith and Wessen revelver from a dresser drawer and fired three shets at Wheeler as he was standing near her reom two of the took effect one under the left eye, the bullet penetreving the brain and the ether in the right thigh above the knee, wheeler after being shet

recled a distance of about twenty feet and fell to the sidewalk where he expired immediately after falling Ophelia Williams was arrested by Capt. Lewis W. Rawlings, Patrelman George Jacob and Patrelman Edward Fitzpatrick at the cerner of Dryades and Lafayette sts immediately after the killing and the revelver which she still held in her hand was turned ever to Patra elman Geerge Jacob who in turn turned it ever to Clerk Reich of the Corener's Office where an examination showed that three chambers were discharged and three, leaded. The Coroner's Office was netified by Patrolman Edward Fitzpatrick and the bedy was erdered removed to the Morgue in the First Precinct Patrel Wagen in charge of Patrel Driver Daniel Meran and Patrolmen Edward Fitspatrick and George Raceb, Clerk Jeseph Rejas netified Clark and Operator Maurice W. Heath of the Inspector's effice at IO-05 ecleck A.M. and he in turn netified District Atty.St. Clair Adams, Special te the District Atty-Jerry Kane, Inspecter of Pelice, the Hen, James W. Reynelds, Chief of Detectives George Long, Asst, Chief of Detectives Daniel F. Meuney and Special to the Inspector James W. Grady were on the scene immedistely after the killing and were of material assistance in conducting the investigation.

The hedy of Jeseph Wheeler was searched immediately upon their arrival by Capt. Lewis W. Rawlings and Patrelman George Jacob and the only weapon:

found was a closed pecket knife in the right, front pants pecket.

I would report that about 12,45 this P.M. Corpl. Charles Traub reports that about 8-45 P M Wednesday
July 26th, 1911, Henry Oilver, aged 29 years, single, a laborer by
accupation, residing No. 911 St. Peter Street, was stabbed four times
and dangerously wounded, once in the right breast and three times in
the back with a knife by Alvin Wells, aged 27 years, a glazier by
accupation, of Meridian, Miss, but stopping at No.1008 Iberville St.
while in the house of prostitution conducted by Wilhelmene Fretag
at No. 1555 Bienville Street. Henry Oliver was conveyed in the
ambulance to the Charity Hospital where he lingered until 11-40 P M
Nonday August 14th, 1911 when he died from his wounds.

Upon investigation it was learned that Henry Oliver went into Wilhelmene Fretag's house and paid her fifty cents to go to bed with him which she did. Afterwood Oliver wanted to stay all night and the Fretag woman wanted more money which Oliver refused to pay. The woman then ordered him to leave and he refused to do so. The Fretag woman then went and got Alvin Wells at the corner of Bienville and Marais

Treete and when Wells and the woman returned to put Oliver out of the unuse a fight took place between both men and Oliver was stabbed as the corner of Bienville and Villerre Sts. and taken to the Charity Hospital where he was fully identified by Oliver as the man who had stabbed him. Wells was then locked up in this station charged with "Satbbing and dangerously wounding" Wilhelmene Fretagend Louis Offner were both locked up and charged with being material itnesses. An atopsy was held on Henry Oliver's body by Asst. Cornner C.

An affidavit will be made this A M August 15th, 1911 charging Alvin with "Murder". A duplicate copy of statements of witnesses were forwarded your office at time of stabbing. The knife with which the stabbing was done was not recovered.

I would report, having received information, at 1055. A. M. this Sunday August 20th 1911. from the Inspectors office, that a murder, . had been committed at Rigolets, Louisiana, I in company of Patrolman

Henry Mocklin and Joseph Sharp, proceeded to the Rigolets on the 515 P. M. train, and i made an investigation, and ascertained from Witneses That at between 8. and 9. A. M. This Sunday August 20th 1911. A negro named Ed, Irington, age 25 years, and residing at Rigolets Section house Rigolets La, where he is employed as a section hand, and another Negro ed Alex Hill, age 24 years, also residing at Rigolets section house

and employed as a section hand in the Rigolets Section house, became

engaged in a fight over Irington, accusing Alex Hill, of stealing 44.75. from his pants pocket, while he was asleep. . Irvington, slapped

Alex Hill, in the face, and Hill went outside of the section house, and picked up a piece of iron, with which he struck Irington bok of the head, while he was stooping over his bunk, looking for his money. Irington, then grabbed Mill and threw him over one of Aly bunks, in the

rece, and picking up an iron bolt about 6 inches, long struck Hill, over the head, with it . A negro fisherman named Dan Davis, living at the Rigolets nto the section house and seperated the men, and Hill ran on the outsid and ran up the track, towards the lake , followed by Irington , who had stick in his hand and after chasing Hill, up the track a distance of 1/2 mile , Irington was heard by Thomas , R. Abadie, a white man residing at the Rigolets, to say, to Hill, come back, and Hill answered No I wont come back If I do , you will kill me, Irington kept on advancing on Hill with a stick in his hand in a threatening attitude, and Hill jumped into the lake, and was drowned . Mr Abadie, states that Irington, did not strike Hill with the stick when he jumped overboard, as Irington, was about six feet from Hill then he jumped overboard . Mr Abadie is the only eye witness, to the drowning ef Hill, Mr Abadie, ran after the negro Irington , after the drowning and captured him and brought him to the 5th precinct station, on the 1155. A. M. Louisville and Nashville train, and he was charged with the murder of Alex Hill. Statements, were taken from the following negro section hands, who were in the Rigolets Section house at the time of the fight between Alex Hill, and Ed Trington, Goldsmith Minor, . Lewis Mitchell, Robert Coleman, Cleveland Jones. James. C. Perdue. Dave Ranston. Dan Davis. all of the above witnessed. the fight between Ed Irington, Alex Hill, at the section house, but they all state , that they know nothing of the drowning of Alex Hill, as Hill was shased up the Railroad track, for a distance of fully 1/2 mile and none of them followed behind the men . A statement, was laso taken from Thomas R. Abadie, as was a statement taken from Ed Irington , the accused . The body of Alex Hill, was not recovered . The stick which Irington had, also the Railroad boat was brought to this station, by Mr Abadie, and will be sent to the Coroners office in the A. M. . Inspectors Office notified by myself at 935. P. M. as was the Coroners office, also the District Attorney StClair Adams. . Attached find statements. . Irington has a scalp wound in the back of his head; and a wound in his right cheek, which he states was inflicted by Hill.







## Detailed Report.

I would report on Tuesday November 1st 1911, at 9:50,0 clovck A.W. haing received a telephone call to send the patrolwagon, and also to notify the Charity Hospital, to send the ambulance to the corner of Penniston and Maganolia streets, as there was a white man shot, and one of themen that took part in the shooting was being held under arrest. Immediately on receipts of the above information I proceed ded to the locality mentioned in the patrol-wagon , and when arriving on the scene, a color man by the name of Theophile Rodgers, residing at #4116 Maganolia street, gave over into my charge a white man whom he had under arrest, and informed he that the man whom had been accompained by another white man had shot Mr Edgar Farrar residing at #2638 Milan street. The prisoner was placed in the Seventh Precinct patrol-wagon, which was in charge of Patrolman Patrick Manning, and as ives-tigation immediatley started. Mr Farrar was found in a vacant lot on Penniston near aganolia streets, suffering from a gun shot wound in the left side of the breast. I immediately summoned the ambula-ce, but before its arrival the wounded man expired? From information reneived it was learned that the color de man Theophile Rodgers, had seen two white men coming out of the residence , of Mr Farrar, this morning, who crossed over Napoleon Avenue. Rodgers who is emp-loyed as a driver of a wagon, and who was triving his team at the time endeavored to get some one to mind his wagon and sceing no one, went to the residence of Mr Farrar, whom he met at home, and informed him of the facts. Together, both Mr Farrar and the negro Rodgers went in seach of the men and saw both of them on Napeleon Avenue and watched them as they turned into Saratoga street going to milan and thence to Rampart and General Taylor streets, and back to General Taylor to Frerret streets to Penniston street, During all of this time both men were kept in view by Mr Farrar and Rodgers. At this juncture Mr. Farrar, decided to approach the men, but was advised by the colored man, Rodgers, not to do so unless news prepared and Mr Mr Farrar

conserved that nothing would occur, as it was borad day Right, at the same time running across the open square at the corner of Penniston, and Magan-lia streets, and coming on both men whom he caught hold of, and at the same time called out for assistance? One or the men succeeded in getting tree from the grasp of ir Farrar, but was given chase to by the negro Rodgers before he succeeded in getting away from the acene who captured and held on to him. In the meantime the other man got away from Mr Farrar, and runnings about fifteen feet turned drew a revolver and fired one shot at Mr Ferrer; the bullet taking effect as above stated, and at the same time MR Ferrer cried out to Rodgers that the shot had got him. Immediately after the shooting the man ran and going into the kitchen of Vincint Poudolph'ss residence en South Derbigny between Cadiz and Jena streets, where he was in hiding, when placed under arrest by Chief of Detectives George Long. Detective James Brewer, Corporal Joseph Johnston of the Twelfth Precinct and Special Officer Louis J. After committing the deed Johnson made his escape through an alley which leads into the house, before the arrival of the Officers.

The ambulance was summened and Carrie Taylor was conveyed to the enrity Hespital where she expired at about 11 e'cleck A.M., Friday, December 15th 1911. The Corener was immediately netified after y the receipt of the news of the weman's death which was at about 3. o'clock P.M., December 15th inst, also your office and the District Attorney at the same time by Clerk and Opr Yves A. Sergeant William Feterson reports that about 8,30 0 Clock this F.M. Saturday December 23rd, 1911, Edward Hancock, (col) aged 25 years, a laborer by occupation, residing at Second and Galvez Sts, was shot once in the left thigh, once in the spinal colum on the righ side and lodged in the heart by Homer Howard alias Burril Thomas (col) aged 19 years, residing at #2516 Poydras St, employed as a laborer by Felican Box Factory at Julia and Miro Sts. Hancock dying almost instantly. Howard alias Thomas made his escape for the time being but was later arrested in the Felican Box Factory at Julia and Galvez Sts.

From the investigation of the homicide it was learned that about 8,30 0 Clock this F.M. Hancock and Howard alias Thomas were in the barber shop, conducted by John Madison (col) at #800 S Miro St, and became invotved in an argument about the places they had traveled to. Howard became angered and struck Hancock a blow aside of the head with his hand, at the same time started to reach for a revolver that he had concealed under his coat on the left side in the waist band of his trousers. John Madison the proprietor of the barber shop jumped between the men and caught hold of

and prevented him from drawing the revolver. Madison told Hancock Leave the place and held Howard alias Thomas untill he thought that Hanhad gone a safe distance, when he released Howard. Howard after being released walked to the sidewalk and was there but a few moments when the shooting took place. James Brown (col) residing at #2058 Lafayette St who standing in the doorways of James Montgomeys Saloon at Foydras and Miro Bis directly opposite to where the murder took place, states that when Howard came out of the barber shop he walked directly up to Hancock, when come words were exchanged between the two men, Howard reaching under his ment on the left side drew his revolver and fired six shots at Hancock, Hangack immediately after the shooting staggered to the center of the strest and fell, dying almost instantly. Howard after the shooting went to the marker shop but remained there a short time when he again came to the sidewalk and walked to Lafayette and Miro Sts, from where he disappaered. The hedy of Hancock was sent to the Morgue in the First Precinct Fatrol Wagon in charge of Stableman John McGeoy and Fatrolman Philip J Thomas.

Sergeant Fetersoj in company with Sergeant John M Dunn after senting the body to the morgue made a search in the vicinity for the revolver but some was turned over to Sergeant Dunn some time later by a negro named for Moore, residing at #2400 Lafayette St, who claimed to have taken the revolver from three negroes on the sidewalk in Foydras near Miro Sts. Moore claiming that the men were unknown to him. Mopore after gaining possession of the revolver took same to his home where he unloaded it throwing the em-

Sergeants Dunn and Peterson also made a search for Howard, going to the mans room, and to the residence of his relatives, finally locating

o wife station and charged with Murder.



The unknown negro pulled out a gun and pointed it at Richard Brown and himself and told them "Give me that money" he told the negro "I sint got no money " and he started to run when the negro fired three shots at him, one of the photo striking him in the back, he fell and hollered out for help, and Mr Winkler came to his absistance, Rance Horn states that Richard Brown ran also when the unknown negro started to shoot the negro then ran to-wards the Lake and made his escape, A statement was taken from the negro Richard Brown, which corroborates the story told by Rance Horn, with the exception that Brown states that he knows the unknown negro by the name of "Kid" and that he has seen working on log trains in Picayune Miss and Wesson Miss, A statement was also taken from Peter Winkler but he knows nothing of the shooting, only that he heard the shots fired, and that he went to Horn's assistance and saw the negroes to-gether previous to the shooting, Horn was sent to the Charity Mospital in the ambulance, where his wound was pronounced as serious and where he lingered and died from the effect of said wound 9 oclock P.M. Monday December 25th 1911, The Coroners was notified at 11:30 P.M. by Emergency Clerk Frank Barrois, clerk Davis received the message.

On investigation learned that an eld grudge which existed between the two negroes re-newed teday, and during the dispute, Walter Williams, cel, Age 22 years, residing # 1132 Dauphine street, drew a revelver; exsecing this Emile Daniels, cel, whe resides at Galvez and St Leuis sts ran eff and as he was running, Williams fired one shot from a 38 calibre Harrington and Richardson revelver, the bullet taking effect in the right side of the abdemen, inflicting a serious wound. being shet, Daniels bearded a Canal Belt car and en reaching the corner of Canal and North Rampart ets, he fell exausted from less of blood, necessitating his removal in an ambulance.
